Reception

UB School of Nursing's History

The School of Nursing traces its origins to 1930, when Dr. Walter S. Goodale, Superintendent of Buffalo City Hospital (later E. J. Meyer Hospital and now Erie County Medical Center), proposed the establishment of a nursing program. In 1936, the Division of Nursing was created within the School of Medicine, and by 1940, the School of Nursing became an independent unit of the university, dedicated to advancing the education of registered nurses in teaching, supervision, and public health.

During the 1940s and 1950s, the school expanded its academic offerings, introducing a master's program in 1943 and a foundational nursing program in 1950. A milestone in 1988 marked the launch of the Doctor of Nursing Science (DNS) program, the first nursing doctoral program within the State University of New York (SUNY) system. Building on this foundation, the school introduced a research-focused PhD program in 2004 and, in 2012, expanded its doctoral offerings with the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program, designed for both bachelor's-prepared nurses seeking a direct pathway to a doctorate and master's-prepared nurse practitioners advancing their expertise.

Today, the School of Nursing remains committed to preparing future nursing professionals through rigorous undergraduate and graduate programs. With a focus on clinical excellence, critical thinking, and evidence-based practice, the school fosters an environment of innovation and lifelong learning. Its faculty members are recognized nationally and internationally for their contributions to nursing research, education and practice.

With an alumni network of more than 8,000, graduates of the School of Nursing serve in diverse roles across the health care spectrum. From providing care in migrant clinics and homeless shelters to leading as consultants, specialists, midwives, researchers and educators in major health care institutions, they exemplify the highest standards of nursing excellence and uphold the university's legacy of leadership in the profession.

The Bonnie Bullough Endowed Lecture

Established in 1997 by Dr. Vern Bullough in memory of his wife and colleague, the Dr. Bonnie Bullough Endowed Lecture Fund brings nationally recognized leaders to the University at Buffalo School of Nursing each year. These distinguished speakers address topics relevant to the nursing profession, benefiting students, faculty, staff, alumni and the broader health care community in Buffalo.

Dr. Bonnie Bullough (1927–1996) served as dean of the UB School of Nursing from 1980 to 1991 and remained on the faculty as a professor until 1993. Her tenure is remembered for advancing faculty professional development and establishing the school's doctoral program, a significant milestone in UB's nursing education.

A prolific scholar and expert in human sexuality, Dr. Bullough authored over 120 articles and more than two dozen books. She was certified as both a family nurse practitioner and a pediatric nurse practitioner and was inducted as a fellow of the American Academy of Nursing in 1978. Before joining UB, she held academic positions at UCLA and California State University, Long Beach, where she coordinated graduate nursing programs.

Dr. Bullough earned a PhD and a master's degree in sociology, as well as a master's degree in nursing from UCLA. She completed her bachelor's degree in nursing at Youngstown University in Ohio and received her initial nursing training at Salt Lake General Hospital.

Through this lecture series, her legacy continues to inspire future generations of nurses, scholars and health care professionals.

Keynote: Lisa M. Thompson, PhD, MS, RN, FNP-BC, FAAN

We are honored to welcome Lisa M. Thompson as our 28th Annual Bonnie Bullough lecturer.

Thompson is a tenured professor in the Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing at Emory University, with a joint appointment in the Gangarosa Department of Environmental Health in the Rollins School of Public Health. Her work focuses on air pollution, climate change, and implementation science, with a commitment to improving women's health globally. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, a member of Emory's Network for Evaluation and Implementation Sciences (NEISE), and an affiliate of the Emory Climate Research Initiative.

Thompson has spent over two decades working on household air pollution research in Guatemala, including the multi-country Household Air Pollution Intervention Network (HAPIN) stove intervention trial. She currently leads *Ecolectivos*, a village-level cluster randomized trial aimed at reducing plastic waste burning in rural Guatemalan households using participatory action research and implementation science.

Before joining Emory in 2017, Thompson was on faculty at the University of California, San Francisco School of Nursing. She earned her BSN, MSN, and FNP degrees from San Francisco State University and completed her MS and PhD in Environmental Health Sciences at the University of California, Berkeley.

In addition to her academic work, Thompson spent 18 years as a nurse and family nurse practitioner at La Clinica de la Raza in Oakland, California, a community clinic serving primarily Spanish-speaking patients. Since 2014, she has volunteered as a family nurse practitioner at the Street Level Health Project, which provides free health care to primarily undocumented and uninsured individuals in East Oakland.
